Little Girl. A 9yr old 13.3hh red Roan by Wyndham's boots n all out of a quarter horse mare Miss Destiny. Destiny was purchased 18mths ago from Darwin and is proving herself a great partner for her rider. The pair regularly compete on the ABHA barrel circuit travelling throughout new. They had success at the last Moonbi Magic barrel day winning the 8 and under age division. Beetle and Destiny also compete along side mum and dad at ATRA jackpots.

In 2017 they won the Northern Region and the Australia championship Under 7yrs barrel

racing titles. They are now trying their hands at breakaway roping and after lots of practice dummy roping are now roping calves in their home arena. They are also members of Mendooran pony club and can be found competing with great success at local Gymkanna and show. They competed at their first

nationals this year becoming champion of the dressage small fries prep A. Destiny is a wonderful example of the versatility of the paint horse breed and along with her rider I think we will see a lot more of them.




Event Spotlight <u>SHOWMANSHIP</u>

Showmanship is a beautiful dance between two partners so a pattern needs to be clean and have a flow. The top showmanship competitors move with grace and fluidity that makes you

want to watch. This class focuses on presentation and testing your horsemanship skills. There is a focus on three main skills of horsemanship and presents these through the pivot, back up and the set up. Many judges like to see a competitor exhibiting their animal with a smile on their face, a gentle manner with their horse and most of

all confidence. #Training Tip: PRACTICE, PRACTICE!



1. Trot to Judge.

- 2. Set up for full inspection.
- 3. After inspection, execute 1 1/2 turns and walk 1/2 of line.
- 4. Stop, back two horse lengths.
- 5. 3/4 turn and trot.

6. Halt and set-up, when set up is complete, exit at a walk or jog.



Horse Spotlight

Royal Heart Throb (7003) is a paint-bred gelding. He is known as Drover.

He was foaled in November 1997 so is an experienced competitor.

He was bred by a friend of mine, Peter Simpson. He was started under saddle when I purchased him. I have trained him with help from lots of people and lots of encouragement from many clubs. At this time I am waiting for a ROM in barrel racing (we have the 10 points). This is very important because he has qualified to become a PAINT HORSE OF AUSTRALIA SUPREME CHAMPION.

He is a very special horse. He is also very easy to train and enjoys being challenged. He is still very competitive and still wants to go on the truck to events (he is very offended if I leave without him and lets me know by being difficult to catch the next day). We compete in dressage at FEI level and do Inter A and Inter B (he can do piaffe and passage) and he competes against purpose-bred dressage horses and recently achieved 65% with an International Judge. He will try anything – cow sports to jumping to Pony Club to lead line at Nationals. It is a very special treat for a grandchild to ride Drover. He is well aware that he is special and likes and expects, licorice, carrots, apples, crisps.

Drover quickly proved to be as trainable and versatile as his siblings and it wasn't long before Jill won her first National title with him. In the many years since he has proven that he can handle almost any event, from western to dressage, cow sports to pony club and sporting, and everything in between. And at an age now when most horses have long since retired Drover continues to be competitive and continues to earn National titles.



There has been a lot of hard work put in to achieve the results that Jill and her best mate have so far obtained and they thoroughly deserve every accolade that comes their way. Becoming what is believed to be the first Paint Horse in Australia to qualify for the Paint Horse Supreme Champion award is something that everyone who has been associated with Drover is extremely proud of.

Not bad for a plain bay gelding that the breeders' father suggested might make a good drover's horse!


