Copies of the audit will be available for members from Wednesday 24th April, when received from the Auditor. Both reviews have confirmed a surplus of approximately \$35,000 for the year. 4 NOTICES OF MOTION

4.1 Motion 1:

That the Board of Directors be given authority to raise funds for the building of a new purpose designed office space or the purchase of suitable office space in an area to be determined. This will be achieved by:

- Utilising the current building fund which stands at \$87700, with \$3900 interest due in the next 12 months.
- 2. Placing a one off building levy of \$200 on every adult member,
- 3. Placing a one off building levy of \$100 on every youth member. (A youth member could opt to forego payment of the \$100 until they were an adult member and then pay the full \$200),
- 4. Offering any person/organisation the right to purchase a construction plaque, Platinum (\$5000), Gold (\$3000), Silver (\$2000) or Bronze (\$1000) for hanging in the building foyer for all time, and Offering the building naming rights for purchase to a company. For example it could be "The ABC Building" home of the PHAA. This could also be extended to naming rights of the national show for a given period.

4.2 Motion 2:

Rule 111 - Bloodtyping/DNA section (h) PSSM1 sub-sections (i)-(iv)

Delete the following rules:

(i) Imported Horses: Stallions, mares and semen donors, imported and/or applying for registration or listing after both June 2012, must be tested for PSSMI. Only horses which test negative to PSSMI (n/n) will be accepted for registration into the PHAA studbook or listing with the PHAA. Imported stallions, mares or semen donors already registered with the PHAA must have their PSSMI status on file as from 1st August, 2013 (See clause iii) below) Exemptions to this rule may be granted in special circumstances.

- ii) All PHAA registered stallions and AQHA or ASB stallions applying for upgrade or listing after 1st August 2012, are required to have their PSSMI status on file with the PHAA prior to the stallion upgrade or listing being accepted
- iii) From 1st August 2013 all PHAA registered stallions, AQHA and ASB listed stallions and PHAA registered mares are required to have their PSSMI status on file with the PHAA, before being used for breeding purposes. Geldings and non-breeding mares and stallions, are not required to be tested. Frozen semen from deceased stallions may be exempted
- iv) Testing will not be required for any horse whose sire and dam are both PSSM1 negative (n/n), provided documentary evidence of the negative status of both parents is lodged with the PHAA.

Rule 112 - Upgrading for Breeding Purposes section B sub-section (ii) and section E

Delete the following rules:

B. Fillies / mares will require:

* (ii) As from 1st August, 2013, all mares upgraded for breeding purposes will be required to have their PSSMI status on file prior to their upgrade being accepted or continued (Refer also Rule 111(h)).

E. All stallions applying for upgrade for breeding purposes after 1st August, 2012, will be required to have their PSSMI status on file prior to their upgrade being accepted All Stallions upgraded prior to 1st August, 2012, will be required to have their PSSMI status recorded prior to 1st August, 2013. Frozen semen from deceased stallions may be exempted

4.3 Motion 3:

Add to Rule 237:

"Any person holding a PHAA Amateur Owner card, may show a horse not belonging to said Amateur Owner in a Non Point Scoring Event (ie; but not limited to, mixed sex halter futurities, charity fund raising events etc) without eligibility for Amateur Status with the PHAA being affected."

Chris Burton spoke in favour of the motion, Shirley Sommer spoke against. Vote taken

4.4 Motion 4:

That Rule 109(a) be deleted and Rule 108 be amended to include horses bred from two solid parents where one parent is registered with the PHAA. This would mean that horses which would currently be registered as 'Breeding stock' would in future be eligible for Paint Bred registry the same as other 'solid' horses from PHAA registered parents.

Amend Rule 108 as follows:

Rule 108(a) delete words "provided one parent is registered in the regular registry of the PHAA" Rule 108(b) delete word "regular"

Rule 108(c) delete all

Delete Rule 236 (iii)

Delete Rule 237 3.(g)

Rule 108 Paragraph one - delete and replace with the following:

"As of 1st August 2013 Paint Bred horses are eligible to compete with Regular registered Paint horses in all performance events, including National Show, State shows and Paint O Ramas. All Paint bred and Regular registered horses will be eligible for performance, Youth, Amateur and Masters Amateur competition and Honour Roll awards. Paint Bred horses can only compete and obtain points from Halter classes for Paint Bred only horses. Paint Bred horses will remain in separate Honour Roll for halter competition. Horses in Paint Bred registry will receive a registration number prefixed by the letter 'B' and will be listed in the studbook of the association."

Discussion took place. It was noted that PHAA Bylaw (Number 3.3) will be over-ruled by the provisions of this rule change if passed.

2012 Paint Horse Association of Australia Presidents Report

Welcome to all Members attending the 2013 Annual General Meeting and I thank you for making an effort to attend and to be involved in the meeting.

We are pleased to report an operating profit of \$ 35434.00. Overall, but the main focus is the General Account where the PHAA conducts its main business from. This shows a profit of \$36025.00 for the 2012 year. Please note that during this period some fees and services from the 2011 Financial Year were paid in the 2012 Financial Year this being an Audit Fee of \$13500.00 and approximately \$ 7000.00 in genetic testing fees. Understanding these reported figures for 2012 would have recorded a higher profit.

The PHAA have introduced a zero credit policy that means if payment is not received in full for member's work the work is not completed until all owing money has been paid. Yes we are a customer service organisation and some of you feel this is harsh, but the reality in the past years of retrieving small amounts of money from numerous members has cost the Association considerably in time and write offs of \$2835.00 for the 2012 year. The management look forward to implement cost efficiencies where possible and strive to achieve and understand the balance of providing a level of customer service to the income received.

We have seen some changes within the PHAA Office Staff and understand as any business the challenge of securing and retaining suitable staff to provide assistance and information for our members is of high importance. The engagement of our new Office Manager has seen an increase in efficiencies and we look forward to providing the ongoing turnaround time frame for correctly completed paperwork. Overall the office is performing well and we hope to retain the current PHAA Staff to provide continuity and the experience needed for the future.

The management of the PHAA needs to remain vigilant with the current climate. I do not foresee growth in the western horse industry in next few years. We need to thank the current Board of Directors for their level of commitment and in particular Sally McPhee who spends a considerable amount of time over and above the normal attending to PHAA Business.

In finishing I would like Members to appreciate although the PHAA is a not for profit organisation we must maintain the business like any other business, to make money. Please note that any money's made are returned back to you the member by allowing the PHAA to invest in infrastructure and services for the membership. We can all do our bit to help make our Association better.
